# District Simplified Grants

- Processed and Paid by district.
- Provides for both local and international projects.
- For 2008-2009 Rotary Year, applications from District 7750 clubs due by September 30, 2008.



# **District Simplified Grants District 7750**

**27 applications submitted  
16 grants funded**



# DSG Grants 2007-2008

- **Aiken:** Boys/Girls Club Equipment
- **Aiken Sunrise:** Dictionaries for 3<sup>rd</sup> graders
- **Clemson:** Operation School Supplies
- **Easley:** Dictionaries for 3<sup>rd</sup> graders
- **Electric City:** Kenyan school latrine/water project
- **Emerald City/Greenwood:** Copier for Literacy Program and Free Medical Clinic



# DSG Grants 2007-2008

- **Fair Play:** Shelter boxes
- **Greenville Breakfast:** Generation Theater Project
- **Greenville East:** Hope Academy Scholarships
- **Greenville Evening:** GAIHN Transitional Housing Assistance

# DSG Grants 2007-2008

- **McCormick:** Youth Enrichment Program
- **Pickens:** Mary's House privacy fence
- **Seneca Golden Corner:** Christmas Shopping Project
- **Twin City:** Handicap Facilities Wilson Street Depot
- **Union:** Rotary Field Lighting/Scoreboard



# **District Simplified Grant 2008-2009 Plan District 7750**

- **One award of \$10,000 will be awarded competitively (based on matching club funds and project worthiness)**
- **Remaining funds awarded for \$1,000 to \$5,000 based on matching club funds.**



# Factors in Considering District Simplified Grant Applications

- Is the project eligible using the TRF District Simplified Grants Terms and Conditions?
- Club contributions to TRF
- Prior year compliance with policy
- Priority for projects involving youth, indigent people, education



# **If we have more requests than available funds --**

- **Club contributions to TRF**
  - Does the club give at least \$100 per capita?
  - Does the club promote the EREY concept?
- **Prior year compliance with policy**
  - Have all reports and receipts been submitted from prior grants?
- **Are any clubs willing to reduce the grant amount requested?**



## **If we still have more requests than available funds --**

- **Prorate the grant amount based on the club per capita giving to TRF. For example,**
  - **Clubs giving over \$200 per capita would receive 100% of request**
  - **Clubs giving \$150-200 per capita would receive 75% of request**
  - **Clubs giving \$100-150 per capita would receive 50% of request**



# Reporting Requirements

- Progress reports will be required every twelve months for the life of a grant with a final report due within two months of the project's completion.
- The requirements for these reports has substantially increased.



# Reporting Requirements

- **Reports will require:**
  - A statement of income and expense
  - A bank statement which correlates to the statement of income and expense
  - Receipts appropriately cross-referenced to statement of income and expense
  - A narrative statement from the beneficiary
  - A full description of Rotarian oversight, management, and involvement in the project
  - A detailed description of the project
