► **DEB
RICHARDSON-MOORE**
*Author, Pastor, Community Leader
Triune Mercy Center (Retired)*

Deb Richardson-Moore was pastor and director of the non-denominational Triune Mercy Center for 15 years and a writer for The Greenville News for 27. She currently writes mystery novels. She is a Greenville native and a graduate of Wake Forest University and Erskine Theological Seminary.

After a journalistic career covering art, theater, general features and religion, she obtained a Master of Divinity degree in 2005. She accepted the position as pastor of Triune Mercy Center, a church that brings homeless, working poor, middle-class and wealthy parishioners into community. Triune also provides services to homeless citizens and was a co-founder of the Greenville Homeless Alliance and Jasmine Road, a residential home for women exiting the sex trade.

Deb is author of a memoir, *The Weight of Mercy*, about her first three (rocky) years as Triune's pastor. She has spoken at Harvard University and Duke Divinity School, both of which have studied her book. Her subsequent books were fiction: *The Branigan Powers Series* in which news reporter Branigan is aided in solving murders by a homeless man, and the 2020 standalone *Murder, Forgotten*, set on the South Carolina coast. (All five books are for sale outside.)

Deb is married to Vince Moore, who retired as media relations director at Furman University. They have three grown children – Dustin, Taylor, and Madison.
